1	St. Stephen's Church	Albert Road /Buckhurst Way	Yellow brick church with red brick banding, date stone 1876
2	3	The Drive	1930s Art Deco style house
3	The Warren Wood Public House	Epping New Road	Two- storey yellow brick building. Former coach inn built in late 1830s when Epping New Road was built.
4	35 and 37	Epping New Road	Pair of sem--detached yellow brick houses featuring decorative patterned panels
5	Milestone	High Road	Unusually shaped stone; may have originally been a boundary stone
6	St. Johns C of E Primary School	High Road	Yellow brick single-storey 19th century school with stone front wall that complements the adjacent St John's Church
7	Braeside School, No. 130	High Road	Large house built c1870, originally named 'Eilerslie' ; has been a school since 1950
8	Delta House, No. 66	High Road	Large late Victorian red brick detached house, built c1880
9	80	High Road	Large yellow brick detached red brick house with decorative stone work, built c1880
10	38 and 40	High Road	Pair of yellow brick semi-detached Victorian villas built c1880
11	42 A & B and 44 A & B	High Road	Pair of yellow brick semi-detached Victorian villas built c1880
12	25	Knighton Lane	Yellow brick building, built c1860; became Cottage Hospital for Buckhurst Hill in 1868 (now used as a dwelling)
13	14 & 16	Kings Avenue	Pair of semi-detached red brick late Victorian villas, date stone 1894
14	24 and 26	Kings Avenue	Pair of semi-detached red brick late Victorian villas, c 1894.
15	Holmehurst	Manor Road	Large Victorian mansion house set in extensive grounds, built c1865
16	17, 21 and 23	North End	Late 18th century 3 unit terrace, date stone "Buckhurst Buildings 1795"; yellow brick with decorative red brick details
17	1 to 6	Osbourne Road	Victorian terrace, built 1884
18	91	Palmerston Road	Late 19th /early 20th century red brick detached house

19	84 - 86	Palmerston Road	Pair of semi-detached Victorian villas, yellow brick with red brick banding
20	Tower of former United Reformed Church	Palmerston Road	The only surviving part of the former 19th century United Reformed Church
21	70 - 72	Palmerston Road	Yellow brick semi-detached Victoria villas
22	74 - 76 (Foxvane)	Palmerston Road	Yellow brick semi-detached Victorian villas
23	Braeside School, No. 82	Palmerston Road	Detached yellow brick Victorian villa
24	St Just, No. 1	Powell Road	Early 20th century detached house. Linder family/ Beatrix Potter association.
25	188, 190 & 192	Queen's Road	Curved yellow brick corner building with traditional shopfront, c 1880s
26	Buckhurst Hill House	Queens Road	Large Victorian mansion house, belonged to the Crossman family
27	Portland House, No. 89	Queens Road	Rendered two-storey Victorian house
28	87	Queens Road	Rendered two-storey Victorian house
29	Bellingham House, No. 85	Queens Road	Two- storey 19th century painted brick building
30	Post Office, 167	Queens Road	Two-storey 19th century yellow brick building with traditional shopfront
31	Buckhurst Hill Library	Queens Road	Late 19th century building, originally a church hall. Used as a library since 1950
32	93-95	Queen's Road	Late Victorian yellow brick semi-detached villas
33	109-111	Queen's Road	Victorian yellow -brick semi-detached villas
34	191	Queen's Road	Yellow brick Victorian detached house
35	198, 200 & 202	Queen's Road	Late Victorian / Edwardian red brick terrace of 3 houses.
36	12-28	Queen's Road	Curved yellow brick corner terrace with traditional shopfronts, c 1880s
37	Marie Stopes Clinic, No. 88 "Essex Centre"	Russell Road	Large detached red brick house; built c1880

38	Buckhurst Hill Station	Victoria Road	19th century station buildings, dates to 1856.
39	8 and 10	Victoria Road	Large Victorian semi-detached villas, yellow brick with red brick dressings
40	4 (Bedford House)	Westbury Road	Large detached red brick house, c1880, believed to have been built by John T Bedford, prominent local member of the Corporation of London. Home of Buckhurst Hill Community Association since 1950
41	6 (Garden Reach)	Westbury Road	Large detached red brick house, built c1900
42	St Elisabeth's Church,	Chestnut Avenue	Red brick church building dating to 1937-38, designed by Charles French as a dual purpose church and community hall
