1.	Forest Gate Inn and outbuilding	Bell Common	Possibly 18th century, outbuildings thought to have once been a Victorian bowling alley
2.	Walnut Cottage, 37	Bell Common	19th century weatherboarded cottage
3.	iron railings at Nos. 10 &12	Bower Hill	Decorative cast-iron railings
4.	37 & railings in front	Church Hill	19th century detached house with decorative railings
5.	Dane Lodge, No. 9	Church Hill	Late Victorian detached red brick house
6.	Pump Cottage, No. 13	Church Hill	19th century yellow brick dwelling
7.	35	Church Hill	19th century yellow brick dwelling
8.	Home Farm	Copped Hall Estate	Large red brick 19th century dwelling
9.	Home Farm Dairy building	Copped Hall Estate	Red brick late 19th century 'model farm' building
10.	Timber Lodge	Copped Hall Estate	Late 19th century red brick cottage
11.	Griffins Wood House	Copped Hall Estate	Late 19th century red brick house (dated 1895)
12.	Milestone	Epping Road	Late 18th century
13.	The Merry Fiddlers	Fiddlers Hamlet	19th century building
14.	Home Farm Farmhouse	Fiddlers Hamlet	18th century timber-framed farmhouse
15.	Friends Meeting House	Hemnal Street	Yellow brick building, built 1850; replaced an earlier Meeting House of 1705 (since demolished). Friends Meetings in Epping date back to at least 1667.
16.	Milestone	High Road	Late 18th century
17.	Milestone	High Road	Late 18th century

18	Methodist Church, 119	High Street	19th century red brick church, built 1887 to replace an earlier iron church which was built in 1878. Methodist links in Epping go back to 1815.
19	183	High Street	1930s red brick building built in a 'Queen Anne' style
20	208-212	High Street	Timber-framed buildings, possibly 17th century in origin
21	226	High Street	Yellow brick, early 20th century building, Post Office sorting office
22	Fountain	High Street	Installed in 1887 to commemorate Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee
23	5	Kendall Avenue	Large red brick late Victorian house
24	16	Lindsey Street	Georgian building, painted brick
25	1	Lindsey Street	Two-storey cottage in rough render and weatherboarding, possibly 18th century
26	Milestone	Palmers Hill	Partially buried stone, late 18th century
27	Centrepont, 23	St. John's Road	Large yellow brick building with stone dressings, former school dating to the mid 19th century
28	19-21	St. John's Road	Pair of yellow brick semi-detached houses; possibly associated with the adjacent school building; mid 19th century
29	Cookery' at Epping Junior School	St. John's Road	Yellow brick building with red brick dressings and rusticated quoins, plaque with 'Cookery 1915' over main door
30	Iron railings at Nos. 52-60	St. John's Road	Decorative cast-iron railings
31	15	Station Road	Large red brick dwelling, date panel 1883
32	Epping Station	Station Approach	Red brick station building, built c1865 by the Great Eastern Railway when the new railway line opened between Loughton and Ongar
33	Station House	Station Approach	Red brick station-master's house, built c1865

35.	Milestone	Thornwood Road	Late 18th century
36	44-46	Hemnal Street	Mid 19th century cottages, no 44 was inhabited by the painter Lucien Pissarro (son of the famous impressionist painter Camille Pissarro) between 1893 and 1897
