1.	Nos. 1, 2, 3	Church Lane	Timber framed cottages, possibly 18th century
2.	Hop Pole Farm	Hoe Lane	19th century farmhouse
3.	Lambourne County Primary School	Hoe Lane	19th century yellow brick school building
4.	Great Downes Farmhouse	London Road	Large red brick Georgian house
5.	Wesleyan Church	London Road	Yellow brick church, date stone 1841
6.	Boundary Marker	London Road; south side (opposite 'The Chase')	City of London Coal Duty Post, dated 1861, cast iron
7.	Banks Farm	Manor Road	19th century farmhouse, possibly earlier
8.	The Old Brewery	Market Place	Former Anchor Brewery building, possibly 18th century
9.	Isabella Cottages	Manor Road	plain clay tiles, wood windows, 1884 datestone, weatherboard/brick
10.	Maltings for former Anchor Brewery	Market Place	Substantial two storey red brick building, with some weatherboarding on east gable end, former maltings with stables on ground floor
11.	Roding Hall	Market Place	Large late 19th century Tudor style building in red brick with half-timbering on upper floors. Former White Hart Public House
12.	South Lodge	New Road	
13.	North Lodge	New Farm Drive	Small 19th century cottage, lodge house to former Bishops Hall
14.	No. 1 and 2 The Sycamores	Ongar Road	Large cottage in red brick and smooth render, possibly
15.	Holy Trinity C of E Church	Ongar Road	Yellow brick church, façade is painted white and features a large circular clock
