1.	184 - 188	High Street	Early 19th century townhouse; Barclays Bank have occupied the building since 1883
2.	Bowes House	High Street at The Four Wantz	Large 19th century red brick former school building
3.	railway cottages, No. 7,9,11&13	Bansons Way	Red brick cottages; built by the Great Eastern Railway c1868
4.	The Stag Public House	Brentwood Road	Small 19th century public house
5.	1, 3 & 5	Castle Street	Late 19th century red brick terrace with half-timbering
6.	53	Cloverly Road	Detached Edwardian house
7.	Coopers	Coopers Hill	Yellow brick 19th century villa
8.	Gasholder Station, to rear of Nos. 1 - 3	Coopers Hill	19th century yellow brick building with red brick dressings; formerly a Gas Pressure Reduction Plant
9.	Milestone	Epping Road, A414	Late 18th century
10.	Lodge to Shelley Hall	Fyfield Road	Early 19th century thatched cottage; formerly gatekeeper's or gardener's lodge
11.	Hall Farm, farmhouse and barn	Greensted	Red brick farmhouse and barn to rear, c.1840
12.	Essex House, No. 118	High Street	Late 19th century red brick building; former Council Chambers
13.	50 and 52	High Street	19th century red brick building; former Roden House School
14.	Cemetery chapels	Love Lane/High Street	Small yellow brick capels with red brick banding, designed c1865 by Gilbert; original fittings

18.	Oak Hall	Stondon Road	Late 19th century yellow brick dwelling
