Don't forget about your pets! You may not be able to take your pet with you if you're evacuated so make arrangements for someone to look after them - a relative, friend or kennel/cattery.

Make up an Emergency Grab Bag in case you are evacuated. Consider what you might need if you were unable to return to your house for 24 hours. Items on the following checklist may help.

- Cash / wallet
- Any medications you or your family need
- Spare mobile phone and charger
- Torch with batteries (or wind up)
- Portable radio with batteries (or wind up)
- A toothbrush and paste
- A warm coat and/or blanket
- A bottle or two of water
- Some snack foods
- Spare glasses
- House keys
- Car keys
- A book or two to read
- Some simple games to occupy the kids



Backup Your Documents!

A simple tip to increase your resilience should the worst happen is to make copies of all your important documents and store them away from your home. You can store hardcopies or make electronic copies and store them on a disk, flashdrive or even in the cloud (ask your kids if you're not sure)!

Suggestions include;

- Passport (just the detail pages)
- Insurance documents (home/car/pet etc)
- Vehicle registration documents
- Irreplaceable Photos
- Birth certificates
- Qualifications
- Council Tax Bill
- Drivers Licence (both parts)
- NHS cards
