

# List of Buildings of Local Architectural or Historic Interest

## EPPING UPLAND PARISH

1. COCK AND MAGPIE PUBLIC HOUSE	<i>Epping Green</i>	Substantial historic 19th century public house, may be earlier or contain earlier fabric (a public house has stood here since pre 1760). Whilst substantial the building has a simple unassuming simple style. Walls of rough render under a slate hipped roof. Of aesthetic & historic value.
2. ELM FARMHOUSE	<i>Epping Green</i>	Large 19th century farmhouse showing symmetrical classical inspired proportions and detail. A good example of its type. Of aesthetic value.
3. EPPING GREEN CHAPEL	<i>Epping Green</i>	Small 19th century chapel. Modest architectural character, incorporating gothic detail and lancet windows, using polychromatic brickwork to good effect articulating elevations and providing aesthetic interest. Of aesthetic and communal value.
4. VILLAGE PUMP	<i>Epping Green, beside the village pond</i>	19th century iron water pump. Unusual survivor of a feature once common in a rural setting. Of aesthetic & communal value.
5. HAYLEYS MANOR	<i>Upland Road</i>	19th century red brick farmhouse stands on site of original medieval Hayley's manor, moat of which survives to the west of the house. Of historic, aesthetic and evidential value.
6. WALTON	<i>Upland Road (beside church)</i>	Large mansion house, main block is 19th century, with parts to the north and east belonging to a late 18th century house, probably built by Edward Conyers.
7. HUNTERS HALL	<i>Upland Road (westerly)</i>	19th century house with possible 17th century origins. Of historic and aesthetic value.
8. VILLAGE PUMP	<i>Top of Pump Lane</i>	19th century iron water pump. Unusual survivor of a feature once common in a rural setting. Of aesthetic & communal value.
