Of historic and aesthetic value.
MILESTONE	High Ongar, Norton Heath, Chelmsford Road, A414 (grid ref: TL 60604 04253)	Late 18th century milestone painted white with inscriptions picked out in black paint, inscribed 'London 26' on upper chamfered face, Epping 10' on left hand face and Chelmsford 7' on right hand face. Of historic and aesthetic value.
NORTON HALL COTTAGES	High Ongar, Ongar, CM5 9RT	Charming late 19th farm workers cottages. Arts & Crafts influenced completed in red brick and rough render under clay tile roof, with especially prominent tapered chimney stacks. Part of 19th century land improvement movement. Of aesthetic and historic value.
NORTON HALL	High Ongar, Ongar, CM5 9RT	Substantial late 19th century house in Gothic/Olde English style. Decorative brickwork used to good effect to accentuate detail and gables. Of aesthetic and historic value.
THE ROOKERY	Rookery Road, Nine Ashes, Ingatestone, Essex, England, CM4 0FL	Substantial 19th century Italianate house. Yellow and red brick under slate hipped roof. Of particular note is the unusual decorative glazing bar pattern, with the upper sashes having a simple squared pane with flanking oblong lights. Of aesthetic value.

OAKLANDS	Rookery Road, High Ongar, Ingatestone, CM4 0LG	Substantial 19th century Italianate house. Bricked and rendered to front, all painted in a pale blue. Hipped slate roof. Of particular note is the unusual decorative glazing bar pattern, with the upper sashes having a simple squared pane with flanking oblong lights. Forms a group value with The Rookery, to the South, on Rookery Road. Of aesthetic value.
THE HERDS	The Street, High Ongar, Ongar, CM5 9NE	Small 2 storey rendered cottage with pargetting under a slate hipped roof; likely to be early 17th century in origin with later alterations. Originally formed part of Tabor's Almshouses; an associated row of single-storey almshouses along The Street were demolished in the 1930s. The current dwelling is set back from the road, set within part of its historic gardens. The detached cottage has been partially modernised and extended in the 20th century, but remains an attractive element of the streetscene. Of historic and social value.
THE COTTAGE	The Street, High Ongar, Ongar, CM5 9NQ	Small 19th century 2 storey bricked cottage, painted white, with slate pitched roof and central chimney. Of aesthetic value.
