HIGH LAVER PARISH

HIGH LAVER HALL	<i>High Laver, Ongar, CM5 0DX</i>	Handsome 19th century symmetrical farmhouse. Suggestions of earlier origins. Forms a group with traditional farm buildings. Of aesthetic and historic value.
BARNs TO WEST OF HIGH LAVER HALL	<i>High Laver, Ongar, CM5 0DX</i>	Characterful group of vernacular farm buildings associated with High Laver Hall; main large barn is weatherboarded, rear wing is in yellow brick and other outbuilding in red brick. Typical Essex detailing/materials. Of aesthetic and historic value.
THE THATCHED COTTAGE HIGH LAVER	<i>High Laver, Ongar, CM5 0DX</i>	Humble 19th century cottage, single storey rough render walls under thatch roof. Attractive vernacular structure that is little altered externally. Of aesthetic interest.
THE COTTAGES	<i>1 & 2 High Laver, Ongar, CM5 0DX</i>	Symmetrical mid-19th century semi-detached cottages. Yellow brick with steeply pitched plain clay tile roofs. Later alterations have not denuded significance. Of aesthetic and historic value.
MORETON CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH	<i>Harlow Road, Moreton, Ongar, Essex, England, CM5 0</i>	Small 19th century yellow brick chapel with red brick dressings and attractive polychrome detailing. Suggestion of previous date plaque marked 1862, although building in very poor condition at time of survey. Of aesthetic interest.
AMERICA COTTAGE	<i>High Laver, Ongar, CM5 0JQ</i>	19th century cottage - possibly converted from 2 cottages. Constructed of smooth render and incorporates traditional Essex pargetting, under a clay tile roof. Of aesthetic value.
