Introduction to the toolkit

This toolkit aims to help raise awareness of the RideLondon events, opportunities to get involved and the potential impact of road closures on local businesses.

About RideLondon

RideLondon is a legacy event from the London 2012 Olympics. It was not held in 2020 and 2021 due to the pandemic but returns in 2022 with a new partnership with Essex County Council. Essex already has a proud history of cycling having previously hosted the Olympic mountain biking in 2012 and a stage of the Tour de France in 2014.

RideLondon – Essex 100 and RideLondon – Essex 60 are mass participation bike rides on Sunday 29 May. They will start at the Embankment in London, moving into Essex, and return to London to finish at London Bridge. 25,000 riders will take part.

Essex will also host two stages of the three-day UCI Women's WorldTour race on Friday 27 May and Saturday 28 May.

Preparing for RideLondon

Ride London-Essex will be taking place in parts of Essex from Friday 27 to Sunday 29 May and road closures will be in place.

The event could impact our business over the weekend so please consider how we can manage any disruption. Please highlight any service delivery concerns with [ADD DETAILS OF YOUR BUSINESS CONTINUITY CONTACT/RIDELONDON LEAD] as soon as possible.

The start and finish of the first stage of the UCI Women's WorldTour stage race on Friday 27 May will be in Maldon, while the second stage will start in Chelmsford and finish in Epping on Saturday 28 May. Temporary road closures of 15 to 20 minutes will operate on both the Friday and the Saturday in some areas of Essex.

On Sunday 29 May, there will be 65 miles of Essex roads included in the event routes, with cyclists passing through Epping, Ongar, Great Dunmow, Felsted and the outskirts of Chelmsford. During this time, no vehicles will be allowed onto the roads affected and as a consequence other surrounding roads are also likely to be much busier than normal. Public transport in the area could also be affected with local bus services being diverted or cancelled.

These events could cause delays and disruptions for employees commuting to and from work or getting around the county. Customers may also experience travel disruptions.

Please note access for emergency services across the county will be prioritised.

RideLondon – Essex Activation Fund

<u>The Activation Fund</u> offers grants of up to £500. It can be used to fund celebrations, activities and other events to get communities involved with RideLondon or cycling.

Grants will be awarded weekly on a continuous engagement basis until the Fund has been exhausted. It is a one-time-only grant available to parish and town councils, schools, constituted organisations and other community groups.
