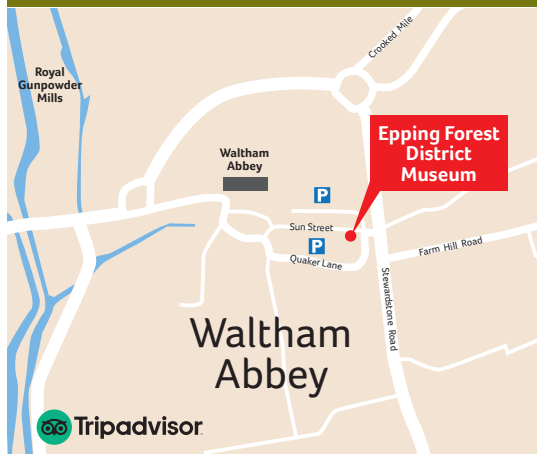

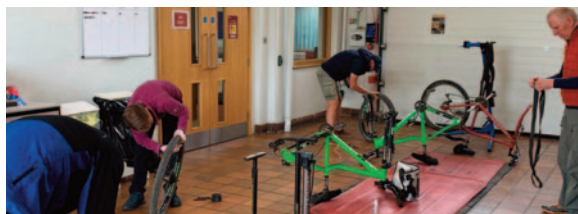

**Bikeability****FREE**

**We will be offering Level 1 and Level 2 Bikeability provision during May half term for children aged between 5-12.** Bikeability is the government's national cycle training programme. It helps you learn practical skills and understand how to cycle on today's roads.



**Level 1** is an exciting gateway to starting your cycling adventure. It takes place off-road, normally on a school playground or hard-standing area. This means that children can learn in a traffic-free environment.

**Bikeability Level 1 teaches you to:**

- **Maintain your cycle:** make sure your ride is in tip-top condition and make simple repairs
- **Glide:** smooth, calm and collected
- **Control your bike:** including setting off, cruising, slowing down, braking and stopping. You'll even learn to pedal one handed!
- **Pedal:** without feeling wobbly or out of control
- **Be aware of your surroundings:** looking behind and turning around obstacles.



**Level 2** teaches children how to grow more confident with each turn of the pedal. Expert instructors will lead riders onto quiet roads, to experience "real" cycling.

**Bikeability Level 2 teaches you to:**

- **Start and stop** with more confidence
- **Pass stationary vehicles** parked on a road
- **Understand the road:** signals, signs and road markings
- **Negotiate the road:** including quiet junctions, crossroads and roundabouts
- **Share the road** with other vehicles

## Short Breaks in West Essex

The Epping Forest Inclusion Project supports children and young people with a learning difficulty or disability through sport and leisure activities and we are happy to announce that Epping Forest District Council has been commissioned to deliver Short Breaks Community Clubs and Activities for the next three years, across West Essex.

### What does this mean for West Essex?

Our Short Breaks offer will be expanding from Epping Forest to cover West Essex, this includes Harlow and Uttlesford.

Short Breaks will be available for both children with a learning disability and/or autism, as well as children with a physical and/or sensory impairment, from ages 0-8 and 8-14.



## Inclusion Programme

### What are Short Breaks Community Clubs and Activities?

Short Breaks Community Clubs and Activities (SBCCA) offer parents and carers of children and young people with special educational needs and/or disability (SEND) a break from their additional caring responsibilities, while ensuring children and young people have the opportunities develop, learn, socialise and interact with their peers.



### What happens now?

We will be working with many different organisations to offer a number of clubs and activities including activity days, sports sessions, outdoor activities, sensory sessions and more across the whole of West Essex. We will be training staff and helping mainstream

organisations become more inclusive and confident to work with children aged up to 14 with SEND. We will host a number of term time activities and holiday activities, offering families the right support and care.
