E-bills issued on 8 and 11 March 2024

Paper Bills issued on 11 March 2024

Explanatory notes are not issued with Business Rates bills, however you can view them here About your business rates bill - Epping Forest District Council (eppingforestdc.gov.uk)

The bills were created using the account information held at 8th March 2024 and will include any outstanding balances for previous years, therefore if you have made payments towards your outstanding balance after this date then they will not show on this bill. Please refer to the self-service portal for a more up to date overview of your account.

Please be advised that if you have reported a change of address which has yet to be actioned (or was actioned after 8th March 2024) then you will still get a 2024/25 bill for your previous business address. As soon as your change of address has been dealt with, a closing bill will be issued.

We highly recommend that you pay your Business Rates via Direct Debit for the new financial year. This can be set up from the website <u>https://www.eppingforestdc.gov.uk/business-rates/pay-your-business-rates/</u>

Important bill information

Business Rates multipliers for 2024 to 2025 are 49.9 pence for small properties (those with a ratable value under £51,000) and 54.6 pence for larger properties.

Revaluation

At revaluation, the Valuation Office Agency (VOA) adjusts the rateable value of business properties to reflect changes in the property market.

The most recent revaluation came into effect on 1 April 2023, based on rateable values from 1 April 2021.

Grants

There are currently no business grants available.

Transitional relief

Commercial premises were revalued on 1 April 2023. Following this, transitional relief will automatically be given to eligible business ratepayers that experience an increase in their business rates bill. There will be no need to apply for the reduction.

The scheme will operate for 3 years, although entitlement may cease earlier if the conditions for receiving it are no longer met.

If the new business rates charge increases by more than a 'threshold' set by the government, the amount of the increase is restricted.

Retail, hospitality and leisure relief scheme

The 2024 to 2025 retail, hospitality and leisure business rates relief scheme will provide eligible, occupied, retail, hospitality and leisure properties with a 75% relief, up to a cash cap limit of £110,000 per business.

Supporting small business relief

You can get supporting small business relief from 1 April 2024 if both of the following apply:

- your business property's bill is going up after the next revaluation on 1 April 2023
- you'll lose some or all of your small business rate relief or rural rate relief

If you're eligible, your bills will go up by no more than £600 for the 2023 to 2024 tax year.

The relief is automatically awarded to eligible ratepayers and there is no application process required; however, the council has been unable to apply the relief to your 2023 to 2024 rates bill due to a delay in the revised software being made available.

Please note, the relief ends if there is a day where the property becomes unoccupied and there is no appeals process; instead, the council's complaints procedure should be used.

To be clear, the bills issued for the financial year 2023 to 2024, will not include supporting small business rates relief. We will issue you with a revised bill once the relief is applied, which we expect will be before the end of March.

For those customers paying by Direct Debit, please note that any payments taken before the account has the SSBRR applied will be taken in accordance with the increased rateable value.
